About the Speaker

Julien G. Patterson combines his proactive approach with more than 25 years of international experience and business management expertise for the operations and management of OMNIPLEX World Services Corporation. In 1987, Mr. Patterson left the CIA to begin his career as an entrepreneur and consultant. In 1990, he founded OMNIPLEX World Services Corporation (then known as OMNISEC International) and has been responsible for growing the business with demonstrated success in providing high quality security and facilities operations and maintenance services. In 1997, Mr. Patterson was named the *Greater Washington Entrepreneur of the Year* from a field of over 890 nominees in the highly competitive Business Services category. The Entrepreneur of the Year award, sponsored by Ernst & Young LLP, The NASDAQ Stock Market, and other nationally known companies, was established to recognize "an elite group of entrepreneurs whose vision, innovation and hard work have established and sustained successful growing businesses."

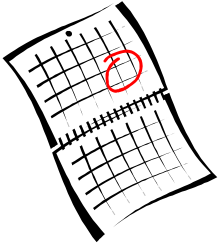
