

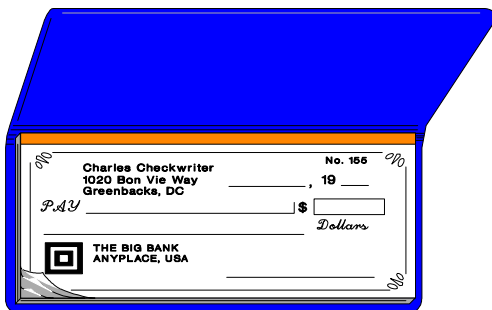

Graalman.....

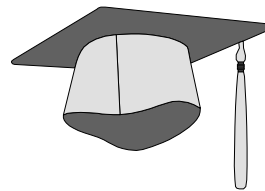

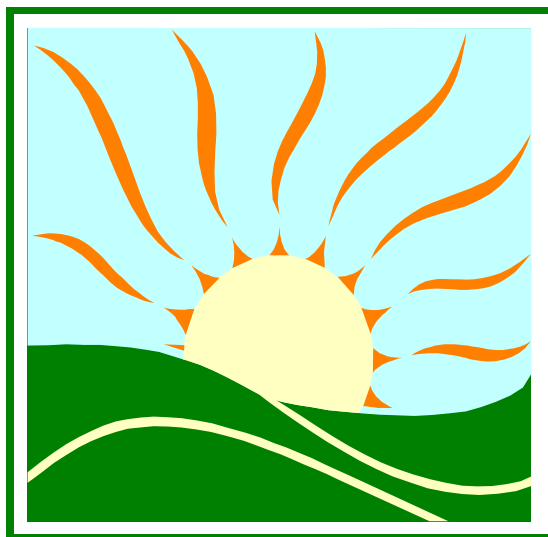
Scholarship.....
